If you attempt to post, you get a message that says your post will be reviewed by the admin for the page and then it is either approved and posted, or deleted. For instance, when the weekend candidate forum was approved, I myself tried to post it to the STNC page to get the word out and my post was never approved by the admin and hence never appeared.

Jon van Gunten, who is a current board member and is also running for reelection, posted the exact same endorsement for Nina Royal on The Foothills. Observed. facebook page at 2:00am last night (see attached), which is the same time it was posted to the STNC page. In addition, these posts, spread over the past three days, were 'liked' by the candidates, so they obviously knew these board endorsements had been posted during the past couple of days. These posts on the official STNC page violated both the letter and the spirit of the guidelines. It is ironic that the candidate endorsement for Nina Royal ends with the line "If we want this job done in full and timely compliance with LA City and California laws, vote for Nina!"
